A Bridge to Higher Education

The Woody and Louise "Bridge to Life" Scholarship program provides support to burn survivors and immediate family members of burn survivors who seek financial support to continue their education or receive technical training. Through the Woody and Louise "Bridge to Life" Scholarship, the Alisa Ann Ruch Burn Foundation and Reed family support burn survivors and immediate family members of burn survivors to reach their highest potential through continued education beyond high school.

ELIGIBILITY

Qualifying applicants must be a burn survivor or the immediate family member of a burn survivor; had his/her life and livelihood impacted by a burn injury and meet each of the following requirements:

- 1. Applicants must provide proof of enrollment in one of the following accredited institutions:
 - Two year college (Junior College)
 - Four year college (University)
 - Post-graduate program (Master's or PhD)
 - Trade/Vocational School
- 2. Current GPA of 2.5 or greater (on a 4.0 scale)
- 3. **Burn Survivor Applicants** must have an established rapport with the burn community through:
 - Past Champ Camp camper or past/current Counselor-in-Training (CIT) experience;
 - Champ Camp counselor experience;
 - Attended four (4) AARBF burn support group or recreational activities; or
 - Provide a referral from a burn foundation or burn unit for leadership and volunteerism within their programs.
- 4. **Immediate Family Members of Burn Survivor Applicants** are defined as a spouse, domestic partner, cohabitant, child, stepchild, grandchild, parent, stepparent, mother-in-law, father-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, great grandparent, brother, sister, half-brother, half-sister, stepsibling, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, aunt, uncle, niece, nephew, or first cousin. Immediate Family Members of Burn Survivor Applicants must have an established rapport with the burn community through meeting *at least two of the following criteria*:
 - Have supported the survivor through his or her recovery as described in the personal essay;
 - Have attended or volunteered at (3) AARBF burn survivor support groups, holiday parties or recreational event;

- Provide a referral from a burn foundation or burn unit for leadership and volunteerism within their programs.
- 5. Submit a complete application packet that includes:
 - Completed application
 - Copy of FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form or letter stating why a FAFSA form is not available
 - Personal Essay describing the impact of the burn injury on the life of the applicant and its effect on the applicant's educational goals (12pt font, double spaces, 1 inch margin, 500 words maximum)
 - Two letters of reference
 - Official high school and College transcripts (if applicable)

Selection Process

- 1. Scholarships up to \$2,000.00 each are awarded each year.
- 2. Scholarship applications and materials must be postmarked no later than ______to be eligible for the 2019-2020 school year.
- 3. The Scholarship Review Committee will evaluate applications based on eligibility, greatest need and overall educational achievement.
 - Awards will be announced by ______
 - Notifications will be send to all applicants regardless of scholarship was awarded.
- 4. Applicants may apply annually for the Scholarship. Previous receipt of a Scholarship does not guarantee nor preclude an applicant from future Scholarship awards.

Financial Disbursement

- 1. Each individual disbursement made will be 50% of the total Scholarship award amount directly to the educational institution, to be used over the academic year. Total award amounts must be distributed by August ______. All unclaimed funds will be forfeited. Disbursements may be determined by:
 - Quarterly/and or semester sessions;
 - Proof of continued enrollment; and
 - Proof of a GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- 2. The disbursement will be used only for the following purposes:
 - Registration fees and/or
 - School supplies (required text books, required materials and classroom fees).
- 3. The disbursements shall be sent directly to:
 - Financial Aid Office of educational institution;
 - Educational institution (or approved) bookstore; or
 - With prior authorization only, to the individual on a reimbursement basis (receipts MUST be provided by the recipient).

If any time any of the above criteria are not met, the Scholarship will be revoked.
